Pilsen Neighbors Community Council (PNCC), is a grass-roots, leadership-driven, empowerment organization whose mission is to ensure that residents of Pilsen have a voice in the decisions that affect their community.

The Fiesta del Sol Scholarship Committee is a group comprised of representatives of Chicago-land businesses, colleges and universities, medical centers, community organizations and local schools. Education issues students and their families face are among many aspects the committee focuses its attention on. Scholarships are an integral part of its mission.

ELIGIBILITY To be eligible for the FDS scholarship, applicants must meet of the following criteria:

- 1) Be of Latino/Hispanic descent and live on the South west side of Chicago within the following boundaries: Between 16th to 79th streets, and between Cicero Ave., (4800 West) and Canal (500 West), OR
- 2) Be a volunteer at Pilsen Neighbors Community Council, OR
- 3) Be a member of Pilsen Neighbors Community Council

- You must also be enrolled in an accredited college or university, in an undergraduate degree-seeking program or certificate program.
- Enroll in a minimum of at least 6 semester hours in the 2012/13 school year or its equivalence
- Earned a cumulative minimum of a 2.5 unweighted GPA (on a 4-point scale or its equivalence)

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants must submit the following items:

- ___ Completed application.
- ___ **Two original** recommendation letters on official letterhead from places where you have provided school or community service
 - *One letter must be from a school official
- ___ **Official** High School transcript (if applicable). College students with 30 credits or more do not have to submit a High School transcript
- ___ **Official** College/University transcripts. Applicants with UNDER 30 CREDITS must also request their OFFICIAL High School transcript
- ___ A copy of the applicant's 2011 federal tax form. (Parents' tax form will also be required if student is under the age of 24)
- ___ Resume
- ___ A copy of the 2012/13 award letter from your colleges' Financial Aid office.
- ___ Essay: double-spaced, typed 250-400 words

NOTE: All candidates must sign the **Release Authorization** below. Final candidates will also be interviewed by sponsors and members of the scholarship committee, and must submit verification of enrollment on the day of the interview

ESSAY TOPICS

SELECTION AND NOTIFICATION

The scholarship committee will review all application materials. Finalists will be selected and invited for interviews. After the interviews, the committee will select the scholarship recipients who will then be recognized at our Scholarship Reception on Thursday, July 19, 2012.

The number of scholarships awarded will be determined by the funds available. Scholarship for full- and part-time students may be awarded. Students must bring proof of fall registration and a copy of fall tuition bill to the interview and copy of fall tuition bill to the interview.

Recipients must be present at the Scholarship Reception on Thurs., July 19, 2012.
